1. Birth and Early Life:

2. Social Reform Work:

- Women's Education Pioneer: Along with his wife Savitribai Phule, he opened the first school for girls in Pune in 1848.
- Anti-Caste Movement: Phule strongly criticized the caste hierarchy and Brahmanical dominance. He was a voice for the oppressed, including Dalits and women.
- Widow Remarriage and Orphanage: He established an orphanage and supported widow remarriage, which was taboo at the time.

 - Gulamgiri (Slavery)
 - Shetkaryacha Asud (Cultivator's Whipcord)

DR. BABASAHEB AMBEDKAR JAYANTI

Background of Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar Jayanti

Dr. Bhimrao Ramji Ambedkar Jayanti is celebrated every year on 14th April to commemorate the birth anniversary of Dr. B.R. Ambedkar, popularly known as Babasaheb Ambedkar—a visionary leader, jurist, economist, and the principal architect of the Indian Constitution.

♦ Birth and Early Life:

- Born: 14 April 1891, in Mhow (now Dr. Ambedkar Nagar), Madhya Pradesh.
- Born into a Dalit (Mahar caste) family, Dr. Ambedkar faced severe social discrimination from a young age.
- Despite many hardships, he pursued higher education in India and abroad, earning doctorates from Columbia University and the London School of Economics.

His Contributions:

- **1.** Father of the Indian Constitution:
 - As the Chairman of the Drafting Committee, Dr. Ambedkar played a key role in framing the Constitution of India, ensuring justice, liberty, equality, and fraternity for all citizens.
- 2. Social Reformer:
 - He fought against untouchability, caste oppression, and worked tirelessly for the upliftment of the Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, and women.
 - He advocated for equal rights, education, and social justice.
- 3. Education Advocate:
 - He firmly believed that education is the path to freedom, especially for the oppressed. He once said, *"Educate, Agitate, Organize."*
- 4. Political Leader:
 - He served as the first Law Minister of Independent India and founded the Scheduled Castes Federation and later the Republican Party of India.
- 5. Conversion to Buddhism:
 - In 1956, Dr. Ambedkar embraced Buddhism along with millions of followers, in A historic act of social transformation and protest against caste-based Hinduism.

BASWESHWAR MAHARAJ JAYANTI

Basweshwar Maharaj Jayanti is an annual celebration that commemorates the birth anniversary of Basaveshwara, also known as Basavanna or Basweshwar Maharaj, a 12th-century philosopher, statesman, poet, and social reformer from Karnataka, India. He is revered as a spiritual leader and is the founding saint of the Lingayat sect.

Background of Basweshwar Maharaj Jayanti:

- Birth: Basavanna was born in 1131 CE in Bagevadi, a town in present-day Karnataka.
- Philosophy: He was a visionary who opposed caste discrimination, rituals, and promoted equality, rationality, and devotion to Lord Shiva through Ishtalinga (a personal symbol of Shiva worn by Lingayats).
- Social Reforms: He established the Anubhava Mantapa, a spiritual parliament where men and women from all backgrounds gathered to discuss social, religious, and philosophical issues—arguably one of the earliest forms of democratic discussion.
- Writings: He composed Vachanas (poetic verses) in Kannada, promoting moral values and spiritual ideas in a simple, accessible language.

Legacy: Basavanna is considered a pioneer of Indian democracy and a champion of human rights and women's empowerment
