SHAHIR ANNABHAU SATHE JAYANTI LOKMANYA TILAK PUNYATITHI

Date- 01 August 2025

On the solemn occasion of Lokmanya Tilak Punyatithi and Shahir Annabhau Sathe Jayanti held on 01st August 2025 at 11:00 AM in the Ground Floor Lobby of AESCOP, we gathered to pay heartfelt tribute to one of greatest patriots and visionaries. Through this memorial program, our objective was not only to honor his sacrifice and contribution to India's freedom movement but also to instill in our students the values of nationalism, courage, and social responsibility that strongly stood for.

Lokmanya Bal Gangadhar Tilak, one of India's foremost freedom fighters, social reformers, and nationalist leaders, passed away on 1st August 1920. His death anniversary, observed as Punyatithi, is commemorated every year to pay tribute to his immense contribution to India's independence struggle.

Shahir Annabhau Sathe Jayanti is celebrated on 1st August every year to commemorate the birth anniversary of Annabhau Sathe (1 August 1920 – 18 July 1969), a renowned social reformer, folk poet, novelist, and Dalit activist from Maharashtra. He was a powerful voice for the oppressed and is regarded as a pioneer of Dalit literature and Lokshahir (people's poet) tradition.

The event included enlightening speeches, inspiring quotes and active participation from faculty and students alike. It was indeed a meaningful moment of reflection and remembrance.

KRANTISINH NANA PATIL JAYANTI

Date- 04 August 2025

Kranti Sinh Nana Patil Jayanti is celebrated on 3rd August to honour the birth anniversary of Nana Patil, a prominent freedom fighter and social reformer from Sangli, Maharashtra. Born in 1900, he is renowned for leading the *Prati Sarkar* (Parallel Government) during the Quit India Movement, which governed over 1,400 villages in the Satara district from 1943 to 1946. A strong advocate of farmers' rights, caste equality, and grassroots governance, he also became the first MP to speak in Marathi in the Indian Parliament. He played a key role in India's freedom struggle by establishing the *Prati Sarkar*—a parallel government that operated in over 1,400 villages during British rule.

DR. RANGANATHAN JAYANTI (FATHER OF LIBRARY IN INDIA)

Date- 12 August 2025

On 12th August 2025, *Dr. S.R. Ranganathan Jayanti* was observed at Anekant Education Society's College of Pharmacy, Baramati to honor the Father of Library Science in India. Dr. Ranganathan (1892–1972) made remarkable contributions to the field of library science by formulating the Five Laws of Library Science (*Books are for use, Every reader his/her book, Every book its reader, Save the time of the reader, The library is a growing organism*), introducing the Colon Classification System, and promoting library education and the public library movement in India. He served as the first librarian of the University of Madras, later as Professor at Banaras Hindu University and the University of Delhi, and played a key role in establishing the Indian Library Association and Documentation Research and Training Centre (DRTC), Bangalore.

On this occasion, faculty and students remembered his legacy, discussed the importance of libraries in education and research, and resolved to make effective use of library resources for academic and personal growth.

The program concluded with a collective pledge to utilize the library resources and personality development book distribution to the students effectively for research, innovation, and holistic learning.














ANTIRAGGING ESSAY WRITING COMPETITION

Date- 12 August 2025

As a part of the observance of Anti-Ragging Week from 12th to 18th August 2025, an Essay Writing Competition was organized by Anekant Education Society's College of Pharmacy, Baramati on 12th August 2025. The theme of the competition was "Ragging: A Menace to Educational Institutions and the Role of Students in Eradicating it."

The program began with a brief introduction by the faculty coordinator, highlighting the objective of the event — to spread awareness about the harmful effects of ragging and to encourage students to actively participate in creating a safe, respectful, and inclusive academic environment. A total of 17 students participated enthusiastically and expressed their views through essays.

PUNYSHLOK AHILYABAI HOLKAR PUNYTITHI

Date-13 August 2025

Ahilyabai Holkar (1725 – 1795), the revered queen of the Malwa kingdom, is remembered as one of the most just, wise, and generous rulers in Indian history. Born in Chondi, Ahmednagar district, Maharashtra, she rose to power after the death of her husband and father-in-law, leading her kingdom with exceptional administrative skills, compassion, and dedication to public welfare.

On 13 August 2025 at 04.00 am in the Ground Floor Lobby, AESCOP to pay homage to the revered queen of Malwa, known for her exemplary governance, social reforms, and dedication to public welfare.

VIDEO PRESENTATION ON VIBHAJAN EK VIBHASHIK DIN

Date- 14 August 2025

In accordance with the communication received from the University Grants Commission (UGC) and the Directorate of MSBTE, 14th August 2025 shall be recognised as 'Vibhaajan Ek Vibhishik Din. On this basis Anekant Education Society's College of Pharmacy, Baramati organised to memorialize the largest mass displacement in India's history during the partition of 1947, in which millions of Indians were uprooted, countless lives were lost, and crores of people had to leave behind their homes and livelihood.

The execution aimed to make students aware of the sacrifices, pain, and hardships endured during the partition and to sensitize them towards the importance of unity and peace. In line with the directives, the National School of Drama's (NSD) special play based on the events of the partition was made available to students and staff through the official college website by uploading and circulating the English and Hindi links provided in the UGC communication.

Students and faculty were encouraged to view the play and reflect upon the sufferings of the people during that tragic period. Additionally, awareness programs and exhibitions highlighting the historical significance of the partition were organized in the college premises.

KRANTIKARI RAJGURU JAYANTI

Date- 24 August 2025

Kranti Veer Shivram Hari Rajguru (24 August 1908 – 23 March 1931) was one of India's most valiant freedom fighters who sacrificed his life at a young age for the country's independence. Born in Khed, near Pune (now renamed as Rajgurunagar in his honor), Rajguru was deeply influenced by the revolutionary ideas of Bal Gangadhar Tilak and other nationalists. From an early age, he displayed a spirit of patriotism and courage, dedicating himself to the struggle against British rule.

On the occasion of Kranti Veer Rajguru Jayanti, we have assembled here today to pay homage to the great revolutionary Shaheed Shivram Hari Rajguru, whose life was a true symbol of courage and sacrifice for our nation's freedom. Though his birth anniversary fell on Sunday, 24th August 2025, due to the holiday it has been arranged on Monday, 25th August 2025, so that all students and faculty could come together to honor his legacy collectively.
