Savitribai Phule Jayanti is observed every year on 3rd January to commemorate the birth anniversary of Krantisurya Savitribai Phule, India's first woman teacher, social reformer, and a pioneer of women's education. Born on 3 January 1831 in Naigaon, Maharashtra, Savitribai Phule played a crucial role in promoting education among women, oppressed classes, and marginalized sections of society during a period marked by deep-rooted social discrimination.

The activity titled "Savitribai Phule Jayanti" was successfully organized at Anekant Education Society's College of Pharmacy (AESCOP) on 03 January 2026 at 12.30 pm in the Ground Floor Lobby of the college premises.

SEWAGE TREATMENT PLANT, WATER TREATMENT PLANT, NAKSHTRA
GARDEN VISIT, GARBAGE TREATMENT PLANT**

DATE- 10/01/2026

An educational field visit was organized for 52 students of First Year Diploma in Pharmacy from Anekant Education Society's College of Pharmacy, Baramati, to the Sewage Treatment Plant, Water Treatment Plant, Garbage Treatment Plant, and Nakshatra Garden in the Baramati area, in accordance with the MSBTE prescribed syllabus. The purpose of the visit was to provide practical exposure to topics related to environmental sanitation, water treatment, waste management, and public health, thereby enabling students to correlate theoretical knowledge with real-life applications.

During the visit to the Sewage Treatment Plant, students were informed about the systematic process involved in the collection, treatment, and safe disposal of sewage. They learned about preliminary, primary, and secondary treatment processes, including screening, sedimentation, biological treatment, and sludge management. The importance of sewage treatment in preventing water pollution and controlling water-borne diseases was emphasized, highlighting its vital role in protecting community health and maintaining environmental hygiene.

At the Water Treatment Plant, students gained insight into the purification processes required to make water safe for drinking. The procedures of coagulation, flocculation, sedimentation, filtration, and disinfection were explained in detail. The students were also made aware of the significance of maintaining drinking water quality standards and the role of treated water in preventing the spread of infectious diseases, thereby reinforcing the relevance of these processes in public health and pharmaceutical education.

The visit to the Garbage Treatment Plant provided students with practical knowledge of modern solid waste management techniques. They observed segregation of biodegradable and non-biodegradable waste, composting methods, recycling practices, and scientific disposal systems. The interaction helped students understand the impact of improper waste disposal on environmental pollution and public health, and the necessity of adopting sustainable waste management practices.

The field visit concluded with an educational tour of Nakshatra Garden, where students learned about various plant species, environmental conservation, and biodiversity. The significance of green spaces in maintaining ecological balance, improving air quality, and supporting sustainable development was explained. The garden visit enhanced students' awareness of the interrelationship between nature, environment, and human health.

Overall, the field visit proved to be highly informative and beneficial for the students. It effectively fulfilled the objectives of the MSBTE syllabus by enhancing practical understanding, environmental awareness, and social responsibility among the learners. The experience contributed significantly to their academic enrichment and encouraged them to adopt eco-friendly practices in their future professional and personal lives.

**FIELD VISIT AT
SILVER JUBILEE HOSPITAL, NIRMAYA AYURVEDIC DISPENSARY AND
PATANJALI HERBAL STORE**

Date- 17/01/2026

As a part of academic outreach activity and to enhance practical knowledge, the students of First Year D. Pharm visited Silver Jubilee Hospital, Niramaya Ayurvedic Dispensary, and Patanjali Ayurvedic Store, Baramati. The visit was organized with the objective of providing real-time exposure to hospital pharmacy practices, traditional Ayurvedic medicine systems, and retail pharmacy operations. At Silver Jubilee Hospital, students were introduced to hospital pharmacy setup, drug storage conditions, prescription handling, dispensing procedures, and patient counselling methods.

1) Visit to Silver Jubilee Hospital, Baramati

As a part of the academic outreach programme, First Year D. Pharm students visited Silver Jubilee Hospital, Baramati to gain practical exposure to hospital pharmacy operations. During the visit, students were introduced to the hospital pharmacy setup, including drug storage systems, prescription handling, dispensing procedures, inventory management, and record maintenance. They observed the role of pharmacists in patient care, medication counselling, and ensuring rational drug use. Students also learned about various hospital departments, drug distribution systems, storage conditions, cold chain maintenance, and safety measures followed in hospital pharmacies. This visit helped students understand real-time hospital pharmacy functioning and professional responsibilities of a hospital pharmacist.

2) Visit to Niramaya Ayurvedic Dispensary, Baramati

The visit to Niramaya Ayurvedic Dispensary provided students with valuable insights into the traditional system of medicine. Students learned about commonly used Ayurvedic formulations, medicinal plants, raw drugs, dosage forms, preparation methods, and therapeutic applications. The staff explained the importance of herbal medicines, principles of Ayurveda, patient consultation, and dispensing procedures. Students also gained knowledge about storage of herbal medicines, shelf-life, labeling, and patient guidance. This visit enhanced students' understanding of alternative medicine systems and the growing importance of Ayurveda in healthcare.

3) Visit to Patanjali Ayurvedic Store, Baramati

At Patanjali Ayurvedic Store, students were introduced to retail pharmacy operations related to Ayurvedic products. They observed product categorization, storage practices, inventory management, billing systems, and customer handling techniques. Students learned about various Patanjali products including medicines, health supplements, personal care items, and wellness products. They were guided regarding selection of appropriate products, labeling information, dosage instructions, and patient counseling for over-the-counter Ayurvedic medicines. This visit helped students understand retail pharmacy management and customer-oriented pharmaceutical services.

MAHATMA GANDHIJI DEATH ANNIVERSARY

Date: 30/01/2026

On January 30, 1948, at 5:17 PM, Nathuram Godse, a Hindu extremist, shot Mahatma Gandhi at Birla House (now Gandhi Smriti) in New Delhi while he was on his way to a prayer meeting.

- **Martyrs' Day: Every year on January 30, India observes Martyrs' Day by paying tribute to Gandhi and other freedom fighters. The President, Prime Minister, and other dignitaries lay wreaths at Raj Ghat, Gandhi's memorial in Delhi, and observe a two-minute silence at 11 AM.**

Honoring Gandhi's Legacy

- **To pay tribute to Mahatma Gandhi's immense contributions to India's independence and his philosophy of truth (*Satya*) and non-violence (*Ahimsa*).**

To honor all the martyrs who sacrificed their lives for the nation's freedom and well-being.

This is why January 30 is observed as Martyrs' Day (Shaheed Diwas) in India.

Spreading the Message of Unity and Tolerance

- **To remind people of Gandhi's belief in religious harmony, social unity, and tolerance, which are crucial in a diverse country like India.**

Encouraging Ethical and Simple Living

- **To inspire individuals to follow Gandhi's principles of simplicity, self-reliance, and ethical living in their personal and professional lives.**

Educating Future Generations

- **To ensure that young generations understand Gandhi's teachings and their relevance in today's world through school programs, discussions, and cultural events.**

Observing Silence and Paying Respects

- **A two-minute silence is observed at 11 AM across India to reflect on Gandhi's sacrifices and contributions.**

Reaffirming Commitment to National and Social Welfare

- **To encourage citizens to participate in social service, environmental conservation, and community welfare activities in Gandhi's spirit.**

**INDUSTRIAL VISIT AT AYURVEDIY ARKSHALA, SATARA
FORT CONSERVATION ACTIVITY AT SAJJANGADH, SATARA**

Date- 31/01/2026

Anekant Education Society's College of Pharmacy, Baramati organized an Industrial Visit to Ayurvediy Arkshala, Satara on 31 January 2026 for D. pharmacy students as part of experiential learning and industry exposure. The visit was conducted with the objective of providing students with in-depth knowledge of Ayurvedic pharmaceutical manufacturing, quality control, formulation development, and industrial operations.

During the visit, students were guided through various departments including raw material procurement, identification and authentication of medicinal plants, processing and drying units, formulation section, extraction and decoction preparation units, tablet and powder manufacturing units, packaging, labeling, and quality control laboratories. Experts explained the standard operating procedures (SOPs), Good Manufacturing Practices (GMP), hygiene protocols, safety measures, and quality assurance systems followed in Ayurvedic drug manufacturing.

Students gained hands-on understanding of the preparation of classical Ayurvedic formulations such as Arishta, Asava, Churna, Vati, Kwatha, Taila, and Avaleha, along with modern manufacturing techniques used to ensure standardization, safety, and efficacy of herbal medicines. The interaction with technical staff provided valuable insights into career opportunities, regulatory requirements, and professional responsibilities in the Ayurvedic pharmaceutical industry.

The industrial visit proved to be highly educational and enriching, enabling students to correlate theoretical knowledge with practical industrial applications. It enhanced their understanding of Ayurvedic drug manufacturing processes and quality control measures,

thereby contributing significantly to their academic development and professional growth.

In addition, students enthusiastically took part in a tree plantation drive, during which around 10 saplings of native plant species were planted in and around the fort area to support ecological balance, greenery enhancement, and biodiversity conservation. Faculty members guided students regarding the historical significance of Sajjangadh Fort, the teachings of Sant Ramdas Swami, and the importance of environmental conservation and sustainable tourism. The activity instilled a sense of social responsibility, teamwork, discipline, environmental consciousness, and respect for cultural heritage among students. The programme was highly successful and served as a meaningful learning experience, encouraging students to actively contribute towards environmental protection and heritage conservation.
